"A Summer of Reading" By Rabbi Joel Mishkin

I always look forward to the summer. One of the reasons is that since the pandemic I began, I teach two classes weekly from immediately after the High Holy Days until the end of May. While teaching is one of the best ways to incentivize my time for study, the general rhythm of the year usually doesn't allow me to read as widely as I might wish. Furthermore, the time spent over the summer reading provides me with just the right sort of

stimulation to prepare for my High Holiday sermons. Therefore, I thought that you might find my selections for this summer of interest. As always, I offer a caveat emptor – the list is suggestive, and there probably will be a book or two I read this summer not on the list.

The first book I will delve into this summer has to do with the profound way in which we perceive and value time. It is called, <u>Saving Time – Discovering a Life Beyond the Clock</u> by Jenny Odell. Odell is a rare mixture of artist, writer, historian, sociologist, and philosopher. She prides herself on the idea of close observation, but at the very same time is a master of seeing the big picture. In her newest book she explores the way we conceive of time, challenging the standard notions of time that drive our lives and our culture.

The second book examines the way in which generations have faced the ongoing changes in our society. It is called, <u>Generations: The Real Differences Between Gen Z</u>, <u>Millennials, Gen X, Boomers, and Silents – and What They Mean for America's Future</u> by Jean Twenge. The author is one of the country's foremost experts on the millennial and Gen Z generations. In her newest book she argues that technology is behind the rapid changes in our culture and our world today, driving us towards an increasing individualism and a 'slow life strategy.' I will mention that both of my sons were extremely curious at this choice. "Why are you reading a book about us?"

The third book is an unusual choice for me, and I am really uncertain as to how this might inform my sermon-writing for the holidays, but it is called, <u>"An Immense</u> <u>World - How Animal Senses Reveal the Hidden Realms Around Us"</u> by Ed Yong. Mr. Yong is a Pulitzer Prize winning author who writes for many publications, including The Atlantic and the New Yorker. In this book Yong reveals the remarkable ways in which animals are able to sense, see, smell and shape our world.

The fourth and final book I have chosen is called <u>"Lincoln's God - How Faith Trans-formed A President and A Nation."</u> This is the story of how Lincoln came to faith following a death that touched the Lincoln household in an awful and intimate way, fundamentally transforming Lincoln from a skeptic into a believer.

So there you have it. A glimpse into what I will be reading and thinking about over the summer. Feel free to take a look at any of these works and see how they might be able to excite your intellect over the summer months. As much as I love binging on British Detective series on Netflix and the like there is nothing like losing oneself in a good book.


