In a place as small and as lean as our synagogue is when it comes to our professional staff, the fact is that we rely almost entirely on the commitment, work ethic, and dedication of a group of volunteers for the vast majority of laborintensive duties that go into the smooth running of a synagogue.

That became absolutely clear to me at our services over Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. A Special Message from Rabbi Mishkin

Dear friends,

Beverly and I have a wonderful friend who lives in lerusalem. He is a rabbi, an artist and the Vice President of The Schechter Institutes, the Jewish Theological Seminary's affiliate in Israel. His name is Matt Berkowitz and we have been friends with Matt since our days in Sarasota, Florida. Since the horrific massacre I have been in touch with Matt and I asked him if there was anything that we could do for the Israeli community at this hour of great need and sorrow.

Rabbi Berkowitz responded in the following way:

"Dear Joel and Bev,

Shavuah Tov from Jerusalem.

Thank you for offering your support. Here is what is needed right now. The Schechter Institute is seeking to raise money for assisting the southern Israeli town of Ofakim. It was one of the towns attacked by the terrorists on October 4th, where they murdered 51 people, mostly in one specific poor neighborhood. They need money for the following: to help the families of the 51 victims: to assist the families of at least 40 people injured; to provide assistance to at least nine families whose homes were damaged; and to assist many people who are in shock."

To coordinate this project I will ask, that if you would like to make a donation, you send it earmarked for this project and donate it through my Rabbi's Discretionary Fund. I will then send the contributions directly to Rabbi Berkowitz. This will allow us to keep track of those of you who respond. I am very grateful to our leadership for enabling me to perform this important and necessary mitzvah.
