"We Stand by Israel" by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

For those of you who had the chance to participate in our special Zoom session conducted by Rabbi Matthew Berkowitz, Vice President of the Schechter Institutes in Israel, you were a witness to a splendid presentation on the heroic sacrifices being made by members of the State of Israel. Rabbi Berkowitz explored the remarkable and sometimes shockingly courageous contributions from individuals who did the impossible; rescuing those who were being savaged in Israel. I was particularly moved by Rabbi Berkowitz' story of Aner Shapiro. Below is an excerpt of Ayner's story of heroism.

"The Nova music festival in the desert near Kibbutz Re'im, in the area of the border with Gaza, was cruelly attacked by Hamas terrorists on October 7th. There were roughly 3,500 young festival attendees, and over 300 were killed by the terrorists, and many taken hostage. One story from the festival has stood out – the story of a man who saved everyone he could and paid with his own life – Aner.

As young people ran through the desert looking for a way to escape the

dozens of terrorists shooting in every direction, a group came across a migunit, a small shelter that can be found in the area for use in case of rocket attacks. These shelters turned, in so many cases, into death traps, when terrorists found them. In this story, we not only hear of Aner's heroism in his actions, attempting to protect the people in the shelter he was in, but also in his calming demeanor as he took command of the situation and made sure to try and calm everyone down, saying that he is from a combat unit and is going to help them. He did help, and saved many of them, and in the video, we can hear from many of the people who were there with him about his last moments and describing what he did. Despite the horrific situation in which he found himself, Aner did not feel helpless. He did everything he could to defy evil, fight back and protect others. The story of Hanukkah tells of terrible torturous deaths that were inflicted upon Jews who resisted Hellenic edicts, and in his heroic actions, Aner revives this resilience in the face of cruelty, resilience that was shown both then and now. May his memory be a blessing."



Please be aware that we will be providing a recorded session of Rabbi Berkowitz' presentation with several members of our congregation. In case you missed it, this will give you a chance to view this stirring story at your convenience.

Furthermore, you should know that our special campaign to help the people of Ofakim was successful beyond our wildest dreams. Our congregation will send \$6094.00 to the Schechter Institutes during the first week of January. It is a most promising way for us to begin the secular New Year. Kol Hakavod to the congregants at Congregation Beth Ohr and Happy New Year!

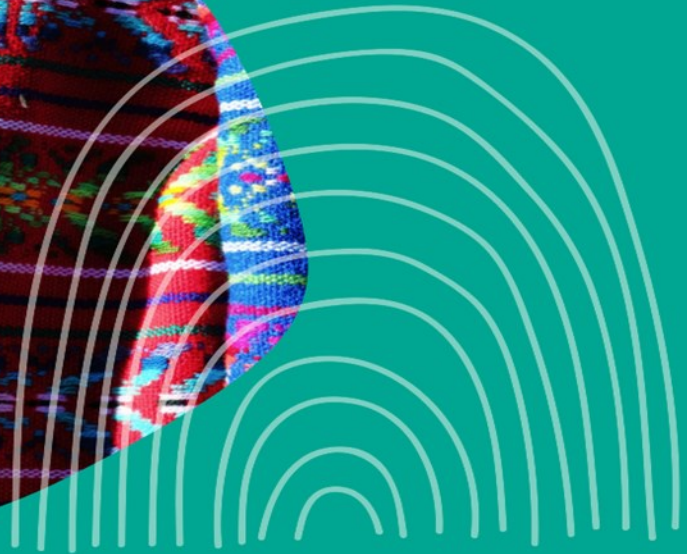

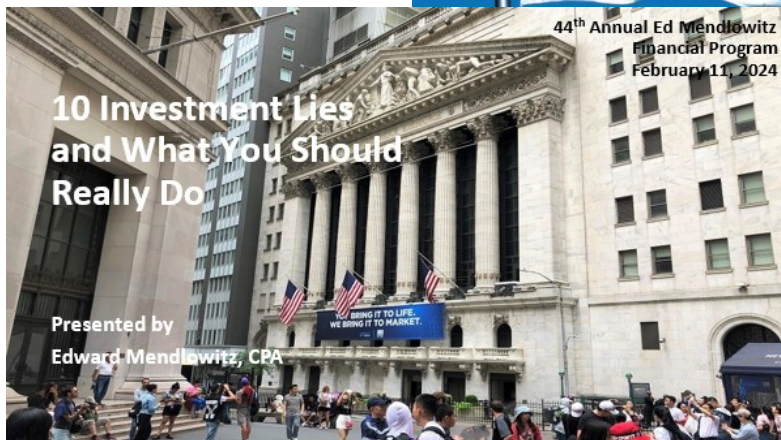
