"A New Class to Brighten Your Wintry Blues" by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

As of January 24th, we will conclude our exploration of Mussar, the spiritual search for a better self. After many months of closely examining Alan Morinis' book, "Everyday Holiness," it is time for us, quite literally, to turn the page. Beginning on January 31st I will introduce a new topic for our weekly Wednesday sessions of Adult Education. Using Rabbi David Wolpe's insightful thematic study of King David, titled, "David, The Divided Heart." we will examine the story of King David as it is depicted in the Hebrew Bible.

I believe that you will find his story most relevant and to

be used as a mirror for our own days as we anticipate the 2024 election year in our nation. All too often King David found himself immersed in moral and ethical dilemmas and while he was mostly successful in his kingly duties, his family life and the tragedies of his relationships with his offspring demonstrate some of the more challenging aspects of trying to govern a nation while having his authority tested. Additionally, the rabbis have a field day in elevating David's stature so that he is not only the author of the Book of Psalms, but also the precursor to the Messiah. In many ways King David is one of



the most interesting and remarkable figures in the Hebrew Bible.

Overall, I believe that you will find this class provocative, relevant and uniquely modern. I hope that you will join me on Wednesday mornings at I I am to learn about King David, a leader of Israel who ruled his nation with "A Divided Heart."

Dear Beth Ohr Members,

Thank you for your 2023 food donation to Jewish Family Services' (JFS Middlesex) kosher food pantries and Essential Needs Resources Program. From January 1 through December 31, 2023, your generosity made it possible to provide 5,869 bags of emergency food to 3,936 individuals (children through seniors). School supplies (backpacks full of supplies) were provided to 187 children in August and September. Toys and gift cards were given to 186 children for the December holidays.

Ms. R, a 38 year-old divorcee with a pre-teen autistic child, while working full-time, spends an exhaustive amount of funds for medical expenses. Ms. R contacted JFS for help. We were able to provide several bags



of food from the kosher food pantry. Ms. R was so thankful that she was able to feed her family and not have to make the choice between new school clothes for her son or purchasing food. Suggestions for JFS workshops that could be helpful to attend, and a legal referral were also provided.


