With the onset of longer days and the approach of Passover our attention turns to spring even if the temperatures have not completely obliged. Given the opportunity for more free time in the coming months I would like to offer a suggestion for some terrific reading this spring and summer. Recently a splendid novel was released. It is titled, "Sons and Daughters," and it is written by the esteemed Yiddish writer, Chaim Grade. Of the two great Yiddish writers of the twentieth century, Isaac Bashevis Singer and Chaim Grade, Grade was less well known but held in even higher esteem in some literary circles. He wrote "Sons and Daughters" in the 1960s and 1970s and published it in installments in New York's Yiddish newspapers. However he died in 1982 without publishing a final Yiddish version.

Following several attempts to have Inna Hecker Grade, his "mercurial" widow translate the work, Ms. Grade set up roadblocks making that task impossible, rebuffing entreaties from two editors over the years and refusing to consent to another translator.

As reported in the New York Times, "Inna died in 2010, without any children or a will, leaving behind a morass of 20,000 books, manuscripts, files and correspondences in their cluttered Bronx apartment. The Bronx public administrator turned the papers over to the YIVO Institute for Jewish Research and the National Library of Israel. The galleys, if they existed, were somewhere in there, and in 2014 the director of the YIVO Institute announced, "We found it." In the small world of Yiddish literature, the discovery of the pages had the startling impact of a lost Hemingway manuscript suddenly turning up. (Continued on page 2)

And so, as of last week, the book was finally published with a brilliant translation by Rose Waldman. In the book's introduction, the literary critic Adam Kirsch said "Sons and Daughters" was "probably the last great Yiddish novel." Giving it a more contemporary spin, one critic said the novel, set in Poland during the turbulent period between the two world wars, distills "conflicts that still bedevil the Jewish people today."

The novel tells the story of Rabbi Sholem Shachne Katzenellenbogen, the Orthodox rabbi of an imagined Lithuania shtetl of Morehdalye, whose three sons and two daughters are drifting away form the Jewish traditions he venerates. His children are variously drawn to the unfettered temptations of a more secular life.

Dwight Garner, a literary critic for the New York Times had the following to say about this book when he published his review earlier this month:

"Sons and Daughters" matters because it's such an intimate and detailed portrait of Orthodox Jewish life in the old country between the wars. Antisemitism is on the rise. Israel is only a heady daydream. ("A new fad - a Jewish country!" One character says.) These Jews argue and argue about what is worth upholding and defending."

MEKHIRAT CHAMETZ (SALE OF LEAVEN 2025)

The Torah tells us that during Passover, "No leaven shall be found in your houses for seven days" (Exodus 12:19). The Rabbis understood this to mean that one could not own any Chametz during the holiday. To prevent the financial hardship that would result from discarding all of one's leaven on an annual basis, the rabbis developed a legal mechanism whereby an individual could sell his/her leaven to a non-Jew for the duration of the holiday.

PLEASE REMEMBER that even if you plan to be away from home for the entire holiday, you must still sell all the Chametz you own. Similarly, should you own other property, or store leaven products in your office, you must still sell the Chametz stored at those locations.

While there is no charge for the selling of leaven, it is customary to include a charitable contribution with the "Sale of Leaven" form.

PLEASE FILL OUT THE FORM BELOW AND RETURN IT TO THE SYNAGOGUE OFFICE WITH YOUR TZEDAKAH DONATION MADE OUT TO THE "RABBI'S DISCRETIONARY FUND" OR "JEWISH FAMILY SERVICES" NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, APRIL 10, 2025.

THE UNDERSIGNED, BY HIS/HER/THEIR SIGNATURE(S), have herewith granted full Power-of-Attorney to Rabbi Joel Mishkin of Congregation Beth Ohr, concerning the sale of every product containing leaven or its derivatives in his/her/their possession, effective as of 11:00 AM. Daylight-Saving Time, on the 13th day of the Hebrew month of Nisan which is the day before the First Seder on Saturday night. This power of attorney includes the right to rent to the purchaser all storage space, vessels, and receptacles wherein such merchandise is currently found, binding, and may thus be enforced in the most effective manner in accordance with the laws of our Torah, as well as in accordance with the civil laws of the State of New Jersey.
