The Rabbi's Corner by Rabbi Joel Mishkin
Our Annual Scholar in Residence Shabbat!

On May 9th and 10th we will be having our annual Scholar in Residence program. This year we are welcoming Rabbi Seth Frisch, the founder of the Lerhaus Bet Midrash, a new school of Jewish thought and learning. Rabbi Frisch has chosen a timely and most significant topic for us on this Shabbat. He will address the ongoing increase in antisemitism in this country following the attacks of October 7th along with its continuing impact on global politics and the world at large. His theme for the Shabbat is, "Never Thought We Would See This Again - And Yet Here We Are!"

In his remarks on both Friday evening and Shabbat morning following our synagogue service, Rabbi Frisch will ask the questions, "How did our ancestors deal with a world of antisemitism and what can we learn from their experiences to help us understand and react to today's situation?"

Some of you might remember that Rabbi Frisch was with us a few years ago. Undoubtedly you will recall that he is a dynamic presenter who has a deep knowledge of Jewish culture and history and combines his expertise with insight, knowledge, and humor. He has chosen what is perhaps the greatest issue of concern in the Jewish world today and I sincerely hope that you will take advantage of this opportunity to spend some time learning with him over this Shabbat. Our Adult Education chair Linda Benish deserves our thanks for all her hard work in arranging this program. Please take part in what promises to be a most enlightening and informative Shabbat program.

To Our Congregants,

This letter is an update on the Yellow Candles that the Men's Club distributed.

I would like to thank everyone that made a contribution to defray the cost of distributing the candles. This is not a money-making activity and the candles are distributed as a service to provide our congregants a way they could remember the Holocaust in a personal way by lighting the candle on the evening of Yom Hashoah. We purchase the candles and mailing supplies from the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs (FJMC). We also pay considerable postage to mail them to Congregants that do not come to the Temple the two weeks before Yom Hashoah.

This year we started late. Previously Ira Donenfeld made all the arrangements for obtaining the candles. He preferred to not have his name included on the committee, but he did all this work for way longer than I have been president of Men's Club. Unfortunately, he passed away this past year and no arrangements were made since it was not on our radar.

Once we became aware of the shortage of candles, I contacted the FJMC distribution center and they were completely sold out. I then sent a panic email to David Glass and Glenn Wohl from our FJMC Region who circulated our request. David Millman (a former Beth Ohr member when he lived in Old Bridge) from the Brandeis Men's Club in Ridgewood and Brian Albert from Beth El Men's Club in East Windsor with extras responded. Andy and I each made one pick up. I want to THANK all of these men for their quick responses and assistance.

I also want to acknowledge the many years of help Ira Donenfeld provided to Beth Ohr and also the Men's Club in so many situations that we ended up taking much of what he did for granted.

Further, since we usually have a short fall in contributions for the Yellow Candles, Helene and Dan Grynberg offered to cover any losses, for now and in the future, so Toda Raba to them. I also want to thank Andy and Phil who made sure the Yellow Candles were mailed out on time.

The horrors of the Holocaust should be remembered and the Yellow Candles is one way to do so.
