The Rabbi's Corner by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

As I contemplate the beginning of my twelfth year of service to Congregation Beth Ohr as well as my thirty-seventh year of service in the rabbinate, I believe that I have learned some very important lessons about congregational life and the pulpit and would like to share some insights with you.

First and foremost, more than any other value, there is a deep necessity for an understanding of the word partnership when it comes to leadership in the congregation. I have served three congregations during my professional life. There have been times when the partnership between laity and professional was extremely clear and well laid out, and there were other times when it was more ambiguous. Fortunately, my time at Congregation Beth Ohr has been distinguished by a crystal-clear understanding of that relationship. Even with our modest congregation and a relatively small Board and Executive Committee, there was never an expectation that I would function as anything but your rabbi, and my rabbinic responsibilities were always extremely well-defined. Even when unusual circumstances arose the Board and Executive Committee always treated me with deep respect and appreciation. I trust that I have treated our congregation in the same fashion.

A second important consideration for rabbinic satisfaction and a successful relationship stems from the understanding that rabbis are not miracle workers. Demographics play a pivotal role in the growth of a congregation and while Congregation Beth Ohr has remained remarkably stable when it comes to membership, attracting new members to Old Bridge Township has never been easy. I have never felt as if my role in that endeavor was held to unrealistic standards. I know of many colleagues who are not so fortunate, and I don't envy their predicament.

Beth Ohr installation comments by Ed Mendlowitz on June 7, 2025

An installation is a ceremony celebrating the strength of an organization and a validation of the optimism we all share about its continuation and the anticipation of a new beginning as well.

Beth Ohr is starting its 69th year, and we are today what we were when a few Jewish people in Madison Township, now called Old Bridge, felt that there should be a synagogue to represent the Jewish presence in the community they lived in. Well, we are still that Jewish presence – and I might say a PROUD Jewish presence with the Jewish Star prominently displayed on our Shul building. There is no doubt that Jews live in the community.

On some level what we do is selfish. We want to continue what we have because of the friend-ship we have for each other. We are closer to each other than we are to our dispersed family. We see each other weekly, either in Shul on Shabbos or Sunday or on Zoom on Friday night or on the adult education classes conducted by Rabbi Mishkin and Linda Benish, or with Temple monthly Board meetings or the Sisterhood monthly board meetings or its periodic membership meetings, plus in this building on the High Holidays and Festivals, and on other special occasions.

We have a lot happening and while no one goes to everything, there are enough at each meeting or activity to keep us viable. We also have some members that do not participate in anything, but they maintain their memberships that provide needed funds. Everything counts and everyone contributes or participates in a way that they are comfortable with, but together we are a team that keeps this building open, our friendships strong and that Jewish Star visible.

I want to begin the installation with a Shehecheyanu, thanking G-d for allowing us to reach this season, this installation event. So, let us all stand and recite the Shehecheyanu.

Ba rukh.....she he che ya nu ve ki ye ma nu ve hi gi a nu laz ze man haz zeh.

Thanks to G-d "... Who has kept us alive, sustained us, and brought us to this season. Amen

I will start by naming the outgoing officers and board. When I finish, I will ask them to all stand to be discharged. Also, while they are cited individually, each of their spouses and other family members living with them should also be commended because of the valuable time they spend away from them, performing their essential Beth Ohr activities. I like being President of Men's Club but would gladly step aside if someone else wanted this position. On some level I have not been a successful president because I haven't motivated anyone to step up. However, I look around at you guys and you come, and some run the service, and you go to at least one Shiva minyan, and Harvey keeps things going on Sunday mornings, with Morty and Mel helping out, and now with Herb back from Florida, Harvey has a regular partner.

I feel a friendship with each of you and enjoy being here. I also feel that same way with the Shabbos crowd. And also with whatever else I get involved in at Beth Ohr including the Gala Committee. I look at Beth Ohr as my "Cosa Nostra" — "Our Thing" and try to do what I can to keep it going.

I also feel that it is important for Judaism, not just for me or Beth Ohr, for there to be a strong and visible and PROUD Jewish presence in this community and the Star

on this building tells our neighbors that. This is a much bigger thing than you and me.

I ask myself if Beth Ohr closed, would I feel I did as much as I could to keep it open? I don't. I could do more, but I do a lot and that is as much as I want to do. This is not a contest and doing more or less than other people is a shallow way to look at it. I could do more, and I try to do a little more as time goes on and that is a compensating feeling. I do not skimp on my contributions and would give more if it became necessary and that is an easy way to allay my conscience. But we are still a Shul and we need people to be here.

I am not telling you what to do. I am sharing my thoughts about me. I can tell you that as Men's Club president I am grateful for everything you each do, and I do not want to do anything to screw that up.

At Beth Ohr some of us, me included, try too much or too often to get members to come more often or come at all, or to participate in programs. Being a member means they contribute to our funding and that supports the Shul and also that makes them connected to the Jewish community here. That might be all they want to do. I worry that by telling them they need to do more, or to do something other than pay their dues, we will turn them off and then they will say "Who needs this constant nudging?" And then they will stop doing what they are doing.

So I will no longer ask anyone to do more. I will appreciate what they are doing and be grateful they continue to do that. They know what we do here and they are know the importance of supporting the Synagogue, and I do not want what they do to stop.

I publicize what we do as much as possible and try to be a role model of some sort. I try to set an example. But I definitely do not want to do something that will make anyone stop what they are doing.

So my friends, thank you for entrusting me with serving as your president and I will continue to try to do a little more than I had been doing, and will not under any circumstances, apply any pressure for anyone to do more. I do not want to lose what we get from you.


