The Rabbi's Corner by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

"Summertime, and the Living is Easy"

Summertime is frequently an important time of year for Rabbis precisely because the summer is quickly followed by the onset of the High Holidays. To be able to cease the ongoing flow of work and clear one's mind is one of the goals that many rabbis seek out during the summer. And it was one of the things that I was gratefully able to enjoy this year. With the pause of classes and the quiet of the summer I am able to enjoy some time reading for pleasure rather than always having my eyes and mind directed towards the next topical idea for the weekly sermon.

This summer Beverly and I chose to stay in our geographical area. We spent a couple of days in Peekskill, New York, which proved to be a lovely respite. The weather was rather humid, but we were spared any rain and enjoyed an afternoon touring a remarkable home called the Armour-Steiner Octagon House. The house is a fascinating structure which heavily favors octagonal features in almost every room including its furnishings and interior design. Shaped by the vision of the many individuals who have owned this lyrical house through the years, its magnificent ornamentation and period furnishings make it one of the most unique examples of the uninhibited individualism of nineteenth century architecture. We were also astonished to learn that the original owner was Jewish and that one room was designed solely for the purpose of highlighting ancient Egyptian and Hebrew artifacts including a lamp that featured a ram's horn for its stem. It was a not-so-subtle reminder of the unmistakable fact that the holidays are right around the corner.

We also spent a few days in New York City enjoying a couple of splendid Broadway shows, a trip to the Frick Museum, and a chance to visit with our dear friends from Florida, Rabbi Geoff and Sue Huntting, who were staying in Brooklyn for a month getting to know their newlyborn first grandson, Leo. After two days of almost exquisite weather the temperature went through the roof and during our outdoor wanderings, we found ourselves looking for a bit of shade in an area designed as a lunch spot for the office employees in midtown.

There were a few choice tables and chairs along with countless benches lined with trees that made it an ideal accounterment for outdoor summer dining. Since it was a public outdoor place, I did notice something that struck me as slightly disturbing. As I mentioned it was lunchtime and there were no assigned tables or seating, but frequently people would spend an inordinate amount of time at the tables without any food or drink. Often, they would be seated alone while no one had the nerve to approach or request that they share their space.

Meanwhile countless office workers would be juggling their lunch-bowls and platters sitting awkwardly on benches with their food tottering on their laps. It did not make much sense to me why someone without refreshments would require a table and I remarked to Beverly that it was too bad that certain people were not willing to share their good fortune at finding a table and allowing those with lunch to occupy the tables.

Sometimes just a little bit of chesed is all that one wants and it was another reminder for me of the days ahead - when our thoughts should turn away from our individual desires and seek out what is best for others and for those who have less than we have. It is an important goal that we all must strive to have during these sacred days ahead as we ponder our past and consider our future.

Ed Mendlowitz recently gave a Dvar Torah on parashah Shelach Lecha. He centered on the meaning of the word Lecha. In the parashah when Hashem told Moses to send spies to Canaan, was that a suggestion or a command. Rabbi Mishkin said it was a command. Without rehashing Ed's Dvar Torah, I had a few thoughts...

I recently observed the same dilemma by my 1 ½ year old grand-daughter. Each time her mother said "no" to her, you could see the wheels spinning in her head. Was this "no" a suggestion or a command. Most of the time she decided it was a suggestion. I'm sure her mother had other intensions. Authority figures don't often expect interpretations of their direct instructions by others.



This article is very different from the one I originally started. Thanks to my wife I have toned it down quite a bit. I originally started questioning the Sabbath observance of Conservative Judaism being that data shows that Orthodox Jews observe the Sabbath at a much higher rate than Conservative Jews, and whether observance was a suggestion or commandment. I then went into the usual pleading for people to show up more often for services.

I thought back to my first job where I had a supervisor who was from Spain. I was young at the time and looking to save the world, so my supervisor would often call me Don Quixote de la Mancha. I guess I was too often "tilting at windmills". I hope I've changed a little. I now go by the mantra that you can't change the wind, but you can adjust your sails. I was opening a can of worms as to what sabbath observance means being that I'm the Synagogue President (nice title for the Synagogue Project Manager) and my job is to get people thinking about the future of Beth Ohr. I'm going to tone down the rhetoric and adjust my sails going forward. You all know by now the problems our synagogue faces for the future.

I hope we can achieve a more welcoming environment for more members and get more tushies into our seats.

One should recite the Mourner's Kaddish at services the evening before as well as the day of the Yahrzeit. The name of your departed will be read at the Friday evening and Shabbat morning services the week before the Yahrzeit date which are represented by the dates in the columns which are in bold print.
