One of the first members of our congregation whom I met when I arrived in Old Bridge in the summer of 2014 was a man named Marty Israel. At the time I was not aware of Marty's many contributions to our synagogue, (he's been on the executive committee for as long as I can remember,) but it was not too long before I noticed that he would appear in Shul each and every Shabbat morning earlier than most of the regulars. The reason that he did so was that he had taken on the responsibility of preparing the Kiddush.

Marty has been doing this for much more than a decade. He also does not just put out the food. He spends time during the week shopping for all the fresh fruits and vegetables that he uses in his weekly salads, and he supplements that with a variety of seasonal treats. When there is a simcha you could always count on Marty to do something special. He never has sought any kind of recognition for what he does for our synagogue all these many years. He just made certain that those of us who would come to synagogue always had something healthy and delicious to enjoy.

Over the summer Marty decided that he would no longer be able to put together our Shabbat morning Kiddushes. The weeks of schlepping, shopping and preparation had taken their toll, and he would now take a long and well-deserved rest from his weekly chores. Additionally, he discovered that the two-hour long service on Shabbat morning was going to prove to be a challenge for him to sit through comfortably. So, what did Marty do? Instead of just deciding to pack it in and attend Shul on the holidays, he decided to make it a weekly custom to attend our Sunday morning services that usually are less than an hour in length. When he told me of his decision, he said that he felt that there was more of a need for him to attend on Sundays since every so often we would fail to get a minyan of ten Jews in the sanctuary to say Kaddish.

Sure enough, over Labor Day weekend we were experiencing a small attendance and lo and behold, Marty walked in and became the tenth Jew on that morning! We had a minyan and before long we had a few more folks saunter into the synagogue.

I am telling you about Marty for a specific reason and not only to thank Marty for his many years of service. Here is a member of our synagogue who, when he found that his normal patterns of attendance had to alter, decided to make certain that he could continue to have a meaningful role in our services.

You should know that this is no small thing. As a matter of fact, it is my sincere hope that you will think of Marty's fine example and emulate it yourselves by deciding to do just a little more for our synagogue in the coming months when it comes to attendance. You do not have to show up every week like Marty, but if you just decided to attend a Sabbath or Sunday service once every four to six weeks, the impact would be huge. As we celebrate the New Year in the coming days, think of how you might also be able to do a little bit of what Marty does so that Congregation Beth Ohr may continue to thrive for many years to come.



Bob was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, nephew, friend, doctor, and community leader. He also lived a life of service, compassion, and pride in family.

Bob was a dedicated Podiatrist who ran successful private practices in both Brooklyn, NY and Old Bridge, NJ. He was also deeply involved in his professional and local communities, serving as President of the Brooklyn Podiatry Association, Boardman and Secretary of New Jersey Podiatry Society, and President the Old Bridge School Board and Old Bridge Public Library and was President of his court at The Fountains, Lake Worth, Florida.

Beyond his professional achievements, Bob was an avid golfer, boasting two holesin-one — accomplishments he talked about often with his signature smile. He adored his family and especially cherished time spent with his grandchildren. His beloved four-legged favorite child, Kelly, brought him constant joy and comfort.

Bob is survived by his loving children: Patti Zakow (Peter), Robyn Wolfe, and Eric Lipp (Sharon); his brothers Andrew Rothenberg and Larry Rothenberg; his great uncle Victor Beecher (Ronnie), many nieces and nephews and his pride and joy his adoring grandchildren: Austin, Evan, Samantha, Dylan, Griffin, Danielle, and Hannah. - Bob's Herman and Frieda Memorial Fund (in memory of Barbara Lipp) sponsored the March joint Sisterhood and Men's Club program for many years and his family told us they would continue this support
- Bob was a co-founder and a charter member of the Hatikvah Lodge Bnai Brith and was on its start-up board
- Bob attended the Mets' Fantasy camp in FL for many years so he had to be in great shape (see 1992 card above)
- Until his final illness he played 36 holes of golf at least 5 days a week.
- Bob was on the Beth Ohr Softball Team since it started, and was a league commissioner
- Bob was an initial member of the original Beth Ohr card game (which still continues)
- Bob took his responsibility as a shomrim very seriously and participated in each one he was able to
- During Bob's presidency at Beth Ohr women were first permitted to chant the Haftorah at Shabbat morning services

Bob lived and worked in the community and was a very active participant and driving force in making Beth Ohr and Old Bridge and the surrounding communities better and more vibrant and friendly. He did not sit on the sidelines and watch. He did things.
