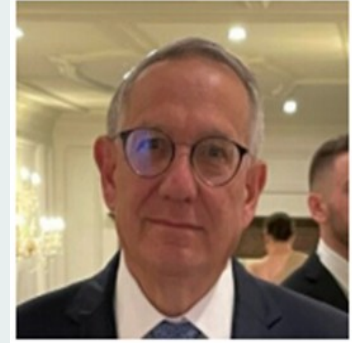

The Rabbi’s Corner by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

“What’s Happening In My Class”

During these cold winter months, I wanted to share with you a brief summary of the class I am teaching this year. With the exception of a Tu Bishvat Seder at the very end of January we won’t have any holidays to celebrate until Purim. With the recent national news coming out of Minnesota leaving me numb, I thought that turning to the details of my Torah class might make good sense.

This year I have been teaching about six to seven students meeting most weeks on Wednesday mornings, via zoom, as we discuss the Israelite generation who wanders through the wilderness out of the pages of the book of Numbers. My class has been enthusiastically approaching the rather dark details of this section of our biblical history trying to grapple with the text. It seems that at each and every turn the leaders of the Israelite community, Moses and Aaron, are consistently besieged with a disgruntled and overwhelmingly dissatisfied group of people who often conduct themselves like an unruly and angry mob. Some of the worst uproars emerge as this generation constantly grumbles about a lack of food, water and the intimidating nations that surround the land of “milk and honey” promised to them by God

This generation can be noted for its remarkable tendency towards amnesia when it comes to the details of their enslavement in the land of Egypt. Suddenly, we find them reminiscing about the wonderful leeks, garlic, and fish that they say they were feasting on in Egypt.

They also seem to have forgotten the harsh labor that was expected of them. They fail to mention the plagues that God leveled upon the Egyptians, or the splitting of the Sea at Reeds. Instead, they remain focused upon the challenges of the wilderness experience. All of this discontentment bubbles over into an outright insurrection as other leaders of Israel, namely Korah, Nadab, and Abidu boldly declare to Moses and Aaron, “You have gone too far. All the community are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is in their midst. Why then do you set yourselves above the LORD’s people?”

This new outburst is a much different kind of rebellion than what has happened before. As Rabbi Jonathan Sacks comments, “It is not about a lack of food or water or a way through the sea or even the prospect of having to fight a battle against giants. It is an ad hominem attack on Moses and Aaron accusing them of nepotism, of failure and of being a fraud - of attributing to God decisions and laws that Moses has devised himself for his own ends.”

In many ways this ancient story sadly has echoes for the political divisiveness and polarization that we see in our nation today. Perhaps this is the reason that our Torah has been such an important and relevant text for us to study. And so, I heartily welcome any new students to the remaining sessions of my class. Let Torah study warm you during these frostbitten months of February and March!

February 2026 YAHRZEITS

The actual date that the Yahrzeit is observed is to the right of the name. It is customary to light a memorial candle on the eve of this date and to give tzedakah in the memory of the Yahrzeit. One should recite the Mourner's Kaddish at services the evening before as well as the day of the Yahrzeit. The name of your departed will be read at the Friday evening and Shabbat morning services the week before the Yahrzeit date which are represented by the dates in the columns which are in bold print.
